The Interreg Danube Region Programme has a distinct visual identity with key elements that make it easily recognizable, while also adhering to visual identity of European Union cohesion policy programmes and projects.

This guide explains these core elements and will help projects that receive funding from the European Union (EU) through the programme meet all the necessary communication requirements as outlined in the regulations (Articles 46-50 and Annex IX of Common Provisions Regulation (EU) No 1060/2021, and Article 36 of Interreg Regulation (EU) No 1059/2021).

The logo consists of the following elements:

The programme logo acts as a distinctive signature visible in all our communication. It strictly adheres to the guidelines set by the European Commission for recipients of EU funding regarding the use of the EU Emblem.

- The flag (EU emblem)
- The statement "Co-funded by the European Union"
- The programme name "Danube Region"
- Funding strand "Interreg"

EXCLUSION ZONE & PROPORTIONS

The **minimum height** of the EU emblem must be 1 cm. For specific items, like pens or business cards, the emblem can be reproduced in a smaller size.

A **clear space** of at least 1 "u" in height and width must remain around the brand. Within this area, no other graphic elements or logos may be placed.

LOGO VARIATIONS

STANDARD LOGO

Whenever possible, the standard version should be used in its full colour version.






LOGO VERSIONS FOR DARK BACKGROUNDS

Ideally, the programme logo should be used on white or light background only. On dark backgrounds, use the standard logo with a white rectangle. If it can't be used due to space restrictions or other reasons, you can use a white and color version.



MONOCHROME LOGO VERSIONS

For single colour reproductions or engravings, a monochrome versions of the logo should be used.



INCORRECT USE

Changing the logo is not allowed at all.

Only use the official logo or the versions and formats mentioned in these guidelines.

PROJECT LOGO

STRUCTURE

The project logo consists of the programme logo and acronym of the project name placed on a wave in the colour of their thematic priorities (see Chapter 4 Colours).

The rules for using logos on light or dark backgrounds are the same for both programme and project logos.


It's best to use the standard colour logo on a white/light colour background, or standard colour logo with white rectangle when placing it on dark or busy backgrounds.



CO-BRANDING

When you wish to incorporate **other logos next to the project logo**, such as partner logos, or any other logos:

- Never position other logos above the Interreg logo.
- Ensure that no institutional logo (representing organizations like partner organizations) exceeds both the height and width of the EU emblem.



PRIMARY TYPEFACE

The primary programme typeface to be used in all applications, spanning body text to headlines, is Open Sans. The specified guidelines are applicable across all print publications and stationery applications.
